NOTES

Option A is chosen by students who aspire to ordained ministry or other ecclesial ministries. **Those considering** ordination must be mindful of denomination ordination requirements.

Second half of *Bible-Option A*: Intended for second-year students who have taken HB 101 and NT 101 but for whom exeges and preaching is not consistent with or necessary for their anticipated ministerial contexts. In other words, students who are not (or are no longer) considering ordained ministry, chaplaincy, or other ecclesial ministries, may substitute one of the courses for exeges to complete the field requirements.

Option B is designed to accommodate students who plan to work in other contexts. Students in this category may choose either *Option A* or *Option B*.

Students who begin a particular *Option* within a field must satisfy all requirements of that option in order to fulfill degree requirements in that field.

Biblical Field:

BX 101 – not permitted for *Option A* students.

Students who choose *Option B* that do not identify as Christian may substitute a Sacred Texts course other than on the Christian Bible (*The Qur'an*) for one of the HB or NT courses; such non-biblical courses (STX) may be cross-listed as IE.
