Association will vote to affirm and then review theological education, preparation, and "Marks of Faithful and Effective Ministers"; recommendations made for further preparation will be based on the individual. MID is given and meets with a mentor. Write a paper demonstrating your "theological perspective and grasp of the historic Christian faith," "knowledge and understanding of the history, theological roots, polity, and practice of the United Church of Christ," and your sense of call to ordained ministry (Presented to Ecclesiastical Counsel of the Association after oral exam). Oral Ordination Exam (usually two hours) assesses "knowledge of the history, polity, and practices of the United Church of Christ". Must have "a call" (placement) to be ordained. * Requirements vary by regional Association.
